I) <u>Introduction</u>:

Innovation and Incubation Centre for Entrepreneurship (IICE) is an organization, established under the Madhya Pradesh Society Registrikaran Adhiniyam, 1973, on September 8, 2016, at Indian Institute of Science Education and Research (IISER) Bhopal for fostering innovation, entrepreneurship and nurturing science and technology start-ups. It administers a Technology Business Incubator (TBI), which provides 'Start to scale' support by providing office space, research support and mentorship for entrepreneurship and facilitates the conversion of research activity into entrepreneurial ventures. IICE aims to promote and support startups based on ideas in science and technology that either have the potential or have already resulted in a product, process or service that has commercial value and the potential for creating a positive impact on the society. IICE also supports potential start-ups by providing them a network of mentors to help them with technical, legal, and financial matters as well as marketing.

IICE is one of the fastest growing technology business incubators at academic institutes in India. Within a short span, IICE has already initiated collaboration with Government, Industry and Academic Institutions. IISER Bhopal has supported IICE by providing space, infrastructure, and establishment fund. In addition, IICE is the only Technology Business Incubator (TBI) in the state of Madhya-Pradesh supported under the National Initiative for Developing and Harnessing Innovations (NIDHI). NIDHI is an umbrella program conceived and developed by Innovation and Entrepreneurship Division of Department of Science and Technology (DST), Government of India. The primary functions of IICE at IISER Bhopal include:

- Facilitating the creation of an entrepreneurial ecosystem at IISER Bhopal and its vicinity
- Engaging students, faculty members, researchers, and alumni in entrepreneurial activities
- Providing working environment, facilities, and mentorship for the growth early-stage startups
- Networking opportunities with mentors, experts, and consultants
- Facilitating the technology transfer and commercialization of inhouse generated ideas, products, and techniques
- Building on academia-industry relationships for innovation in science and technology.

II) Organizational Structure:

• Governing Body and Managing Committee

Performs the functions as mentioned under the memorandum of association (MoA) of the IICE Society, such as sanction of annual progress report and annual budget, arrangement of funds and assets, appointment of staff, arrangement for implementation and fulfillment of objectives of the society, regulating rules and policies for efficient management, formulation of policies regulating the affairs of the IICE, *etc*. All the positions of the members of the governing body/managing committee of IICE society are *ex-officio*, coterminous with the post held by them in the respective offices of IISER Bhopal.

III) Infrastructure and Facilities:

IISER Bhopal has provided a semi-furnish space of about 10,000 sq. ft. and funds for basic infrastructure and maintenance for inception of IICE. With the joint efforts from Department of Science and Technologies (DST) and IISER Bhopal, IICE has developed a common instrumentation facility, two innovation labs, common incubation space, twelve office cubicles, a 3D printing and prototyping facility, two conference rooms, a lecture hall, discussion area, pantry, office facilities, and other incubation related facilities needed for the start-ups. In addition, IICE also provides common office facilities, internet and other necessary support including mentorship support, and networking with entrepreneurs, funding agencies and potential investors. The Incubatee can opt for a given space as per requirement and availability of space. The list of instruments currently available in the common instrumentation facility at IICE, IISER Bhopal is provided as Annexure VI, and the same can be found at the IICE website. Access to these instruments will be allowed with a nominal usage charges upon the request from Incubatee and after approval from the competent authorities. With supporting infrastructure in

place, IICE aims to create and support an entrepreneurial ecosystem in the IISER Bhopal campus and its vicinity.

1. Physical infrastructure and utility:

- Furnished Office Space / Shared office space.
- Shared resources: Meeting rooms, Conference rooms, Pantry.
- Office facilities: Photocopier, Scanner, Projector, Audio-visual conferencing facilities.
- Laboratories with equipment and software tools.
- Common Instrumentation Facility of the IICE.
- Facilitation for access to Instrumentation facility and labs of IISER Bhopal, which will be subject to the approval of the Institute and head of the respective center/department.
- Electricity & Water.
- Internet and Server.
- Minimal storage spaces with safety lockers.
- IICE encourages and facilitates for government funding programs and assist in preparing proposal/pitch presentation for the same.

2. Advisory and coaching:

- Mentoring, advisory from experts on legal, accounts, support for fund raising through government grants and investment. (Work-in-Progress)
- Trainings and workshops.
- Interaction with successful entrepreneurs, policy makers, and industry experts.

3. Ecosystem advantage:

- IISER Bhopal ecosystem: technical resources and interactions, students, library, IPR Cell.
- Media visibility (on approval from competent authorities).
- IICE-IISER Bhopal brand.
- Address for incorporation (for internal start-ups under physical incubation).

4. Network:

- Facilitation for industry connects.
- Showcasing opportunities.
- Inter-disciplinary expertise
- Facilitation for investors network.

5. Virtual Incubation:

The start-ups which are not in position to relocate working office to IICE premises for
physical incubation due to some logistic reasons but are willing to associate with IICE
for business incubation program and mentorship support, can opt for 'virtual
incubation'.

- Invitation for virtual incubation is issued based on the positive remarks of TEC/TRC on business proposal submitted by the start-up and approval from the competent authorities.
- Virtual Incubatees will be eligible for all the incubation support, except physical office space and the other services will be chargeable as per the policy.

Notes:

- i. The Incubatee will have to deposit non-interest-bearing returnable security amount with IICE, equivalent to the rentals of two months according to the space and facilities allocated to them. The said amount will be returned or will be adjusted at the time of exit from the incubator after deducting outstanding dues, if any.
- ii. The supported entity shall pay for the usage charges for the facilities including the instrumentation facility at IICE.
- iii. The ownership of assets / facilities / instruments at IICE rests with IICE.
- iv. Pre-Incubatees will be provided all the above incubation facilities and support for funding opportunities, but no direct funding.
- v. The supported entities will have to pay electricity charges and IICE may charge the internet usage charges in case of excessive usage of internet.
- vi. In addition, the incubated start-ups can access facilities of IISER Bhopal including Central Library, Health Centre, Central Instrumentation Facility, etc. after due permission from the competent authority. Although, IICE will try to facilitate, Incubatee will have to bear the usage charges for using the Institute's facilities (as applicable).
- vii. Incubatees can bring the office or laboratory equipment, consumables and other facilities required for their start-up to their workplace at the IICE premises. The ownership of such items belongs to the startup.

IV) Policy and Procedures:

The policy is applicable to all IICE supported entities and teams, which include start-ups, prestartups, companies, or individual associated physically or virtually with IICE for business incubation.

The policy is subject to periodical review and amendments. It will be the responsibility of the companies admitted to/associated with IICE to update themselves from time to time on amendments in incubation policy and procedures. IICE reserves the rights to make an exception of all or any of the terms for a particular company or a promoter on a case-to-case basis.

1. Types of Incubation Programs:

IICE, IISER Bhopal offers incubation in following ways:

- Physical Incubation
- Physical Pre-Incubation
- Virtual Incubation
- **Physical Incubation:** This is offered to the Faculty/Research staff/students, staff of IISER Bhopal, and to the outsiders as well where they can physically incubate with the IICE by taking a physical office space at the IICE. Certificate will be provided by the IICE on successful completion/graduation/exit from the Incubation centre.
- Physical Pre-Incubation: The physical pre-incubation program is offered to IISER
 Bhopal Faculty/staff/students who have an idea which has potential to be developed into
 a company or who want to learn skills and start a start-up venture. Certificate will be
 provided by the IICE on successful completion/graduation/exit from the Physical Pre-Incubation program.

Further, on the completion of physical pre-incubation, if the start-up wants to physically incubate with the IICE, they can submit a request for the incubation, the same will be reviewed by the IICE team and will be forwarded to the **Technical Evaluation Committee** (**TEC**) / **Technical Review Committee** (**TRC**) for recommendation.

• **Virtual Incubation:** The virtual incubation is offered to the start-ups which are not in the position to relocate the working office of their start-up to the IICE premises for physical incubation due to some logistic reasons but are willing to associate with IICE for business incubation program and mentorship support. In case of virtual incubation, the Incubatee will not be offered any office space at the incubation centre. However, the terms and conditions for the virtual incubation remains same as that of physical incubation. Certificate will be provided by the IICE on successful completion/graduation/exit from the virtual incubation program.

Further, on the completion of virtual incubation, if the start-up wants to physically incubate with the IICE, they can submit a request for the incubation, the same will be reviewed by the IICE team and will be forwarded to the **Technical Evaluation Committee** (**TEC**) / **Technical Review Committee** (**TRC**) for recommendation.

2. Eligibility:

- 2.1 Admission to IICE for incubation is open to the start-ups from the thrust areas of IICE with preference to be given to start-ups having affiliation with IISER Bhopal, which includes:
 - Faculty members and research staff of IISER Bhopal*.
 - Students of IISER Bhopal*
 - Alumni of IISER Bhopal.
 - IISER Bhopal R&D partners (sponsors of R&D and consultancy projects).
 - IISER Bhopal partner universities (having R&D collaborations in place).
 - Applicants from government agencies associated with IISER Bhopal through R&D collaborations.
 - Applicants supported under any program managed by IICE.
 - External startups with involvement of IISER Bhopal staff or faculty as partner/cofounder/mentor.
 - External startup recommended by IISER Bhopal staff/faculty.
- 2.2 Focus of IICE for incubation of proposals/business ideas shall be on the following:
 - IP and product-oriented start-ups.
 - Proposals with clear market/user validation.
 - Proposals with commercialization potential and identifiable involvement with IISER Bhopal Faculty.
 - Proposals with growth potential, social and positive impact on the society.
 - Proposals through government(central/state) initiatives, where incubator support is needed.

*For eligibility criteria of IISER Bhopal faculty/staff/students to start a company, please refer to the Institute Entrepreneurship Policy.

- 2.3 If a person is associated with any organization in any capacity (government or private) and wish to get associated with the IICE for the incubation, will have to submit a NOC from the authorized person of that organization allowing that person to start a start-up.
- 2.4 If any international entity/organization or a person of foreign origin wish to get associated with the IICE for the incubation, then the entity/organization or that person will have to find a suitable partner/mentor from IISER Bhopal.

- 2.5 If a start-up is already incubated at other incubation centre and wish to get associated with the IICE for the incubation (physical or virtual), will have to sign a tripartite agreement/MOU clearly mentioning the need for the incubation support at the IICE.
- 2.6 Applications for admission to IICE will be made in the name of registered entity within the meaning of the Companies Act, 2013 (Private Limited Company only). If a company has not been incorporated, an application may be made in the names of all promoters/founders; however, the promoters/founders must ensure that the company is incorporated within a period of two (2) months from the date of approval of the application for the incubation at IICE. However, in case of physical Pre-Incubation for the faculty/students/staff led start-ups, the criteria for the same will be evaluated on case-to-case basis.


3. Admission Process:

For Physical & Virtual Incubation

- The applicants interested in admission into IICE will be required to provide the details as per the application form for incubation at IICE, the template of the same is provided as **Annexure I**. In addition, the applicant needs to submit a detailed business proposal along with the application form in the prescribed format **Annexure III**. In addition, application for business incubation at IICE by student, faculty member, or staff of IISER Bhopal need to be supported with relevant annexures of Institute Entrepreneurship Policy approved by the competent authority. The proposal will be first evaluated by the expert team at IICE followed by the feedback to improve the proposal if needed. Then, IICE Technical Evaluation Committee (TEC) / Technical Review Committee (TRC) will evaluate the proposal and provide their recommendations.
- The summary report according to the recommendations of technical committee will be drafted and submitted to the expert panel constituted by the president IICE for the final decision. The applicant/founders may be asked for a presentation before the expert panel for making the final decision on acceptance/rejection of the proposal, as need be. The expert panel may include external experts, such as domain experts, investors, or established entrepreneurs.
- In case of pre-screened business ideas/cases by government grants/competitions, on their approval, the same may be directly admitted as per program requirements. Incubation approval is subject to completion of satisfactory review process. IICE will have a sole discretion whether to admit or reject a proposal for incubation in consultation with the Host Institute and the decision of IICE in this regard shall be final.

For Physical pre-incubation:

- In case of physical pre-incubation/virtual incubation, the interested applicant shall submit Annexure II & III of this document to IICE office, the same will be reviewed by the IICE team and will be forwarded to the Technical Evaluation Committee (TEC) / Technical Review Committee (TRC) for recommendation. The committee will evaluate the business proposals (idea) received and forward its recommendation to the IICE team.
- The summary report according to the recommendations of technical committee will be drafted and submitted to the expert panel constituted by the president IICE for the final decision. The applicant/founders may be asked for a presentation before the expert panel for making the final decision on acceptance/rejection of the proposal, as need be. The expert panel may include external experts, such as domain experts, investors, or established entrepreneurs.



4. Intellectual Property:

- 4.1 The guidelines of Institute Entrepreneurship policy and IPR Policy under IPR Cell of the Institute needs to be followed in cases as follows.
 - a. Start-up to be formed using IP owned by IISER Bhopal.
 - b. Faculty, Student or R&D Staff of the IISER Bhopal is founder/director/equity holder in a company.

- c. IP creation involved substantial usage of infrastructure and lab facilities of IISER Bhopal
- 4.2 IP transfer/ IP licensing/ permission to use IP will be in favor of only the registered entity upon permission from competent authority of the Institute. In such case, the Institute's IPR policy will be applicable for transfer/license.
- 4.3 If IP of any other organization or Institution is involved, NOC from the said organization or Institution should be obtained on the official letterhead of the organization/institute.
- 4.4 In any of the above cases, if there are anyone/ team who has worked on the IP and if any of them is not part of the start-up, a NOC shall be obtained from such members for usage of the IP in the startup.
- 4.5 If any IP is generated by the start-up during their course of incubation, the information about its filing and status of IP application should be provided to IICE. Although, IICE does not make any claim on the intellectual property generated during their incubation at IICE.
- 4.6 If an external start-up commercializes or license out the IP generated/developed during the course of incubation at the IICE, then the IICE will not claim any royalty/share in up-front license fee of that IP. The same must be informed to the IICE before executing any such deed or action. In case of an internal start-up, the rules and regulations of the Institute's IPR policy needs to be followed.
- 4.7 If the proposal is based on an existing IP, they must provide a legal approval/permission/license as applicable to use it for their start-up. IICE will not be responsible for any infringement by the start-up on any existing IP.
- 4.8 In the event the company uses any research invention conducted at IISER Bhopal for business purpose, which has not been secured through any IP prospects, the faculty member must disclose the source and origin of such inventions and "Know-how" along with the approval of competent authority.
- 4.9 The Institute may allow licensing of IPR from Institute to start-up: Ideally students and faculty members or staff intending to initiate a start-up based on the technology developed or co-developed by them at the Institute, may be allowed to take a license as per the guidelines of the IPR policy of the IPR Cell of the Institute.
- 4.10The guidelines of the IPR given in the IPR policy of the Institute and the Institute Entrepreneurship Policy are to be strictly followed for the matters related to IPR transfer/licensing/distribution of royalty/equity & revenue sharing, *etc*.

- 4.11IICE will only be a coordinator and facilitator for providing services to faculty, staff, and students. They will have no role in procedures of carrying out invention, how it is patented or how it is to be licensed.
- 4.12The start-up may be permitted to use the laboratory and other such facilities to which the founding faculty member(s) / staff are entitled and allowed with a clearly defined conflict of interest and disclosure. The start-up may also use other facilities of the Institute on chargeable basis as applicable.
- 4.13IISER Bhopal lab usage: If IISER Bhopal labs are envisaged to be used during the course of association with IICE, explicit approval should be obtained from IISER Bhopal including from the faculty-in-charge / facility in-charge whose labs or facility are going to be used. The facility usage charges will be applicable as per the prevailing norms. Also, with view to ensure safety and security of all concerned, all compliances and procedures for lab usage should be strictly adhered to.

The above points on IP explain the policy framework in general. For more details, please refer to the Institute Entrepreneurship policy and Institute's IPR Policy.

5. Periodic Assessment:

- 5.1 IICE will periodically evaluate the performance of its Incubatees (start-ups and Prestartups). Incubatees will have to submit the information to IICE in every 6 months summarizing the progress made by the start-up during incubation for annual assessment by a committee, comprising of experts.
- 5.2 The assessment would be based on the parameters set by IICE which includes, but not limited to customer acquisition, revenue generation, cash flow, IP creation, technology transfer, valuation, *etc*.

6. Information Submission:

6.1 Incubatees must compulsorily submit information to IICE about all material changes or developments taking place in their companies from time to time. Such information could be (but not limited to) change in name of the company, change in business or product profile, change in directors, promoters or shareholders, acquisition of a new office, additional issuance of equity shares though any Angel Investment (AI) or Venture Capitalists (VC), or debt investments. Prior concurrence/explicit permission of the IICE must be obtained for implementing such changes. Further, the incubate shall share the information related to the Board Meetings of the company time-to-time and share information of the meeting related to the decisions to be taken where IICE/IISER Bhopal can/may be a stakeholder. IICE in consultation with the IISER Bhopal may appoint an observer in the start-up company who can attend the Board Meetings and Annual

General Meetings in the company to keep a track of the progress made by the start-up and can guide them from time to time.

6.2 Since IICE is a government recognized technology business incubator, it may be called upon by any government organization/institution to share information regarding the incubated companies. IICE, may, accordingly, call for such information. IICE will take the responsibility not to share/disclose any company specific details without prior permission of said company but may use the information for consolidation purposes when reporting progress to the government agencies and presenting progress matrix and milestones achieved by IICE.

7. Consideration:

In lieu of support and services to be provided by IICE/ IISER Bhopal, the IICE supported entities will be subject to consideration:

- 7.1 Incubation fees / Rental at the fixed rate per sq. ft. for the office space, electricity, air conditioners, Personal Computers and instrument usages mentioned in the point no. 8 (Incubation charges) of this document.
- 7.2 Equity/shares in the company**: The equity holding by IICE in the Incubatee company will be as per Annexure VII of this policy. Further, at the time of exit, there is an option of buying back of shares from IICE by the company. The price of shares at the exit can be decided through mutual agreement or a price calculated by an expert through independent evaluation, appointed with mutual consent. Consideration of equity share holding by the IICE would be as per the institute Entrepreneurship Policy, approved by the competent authority.

**<u>Note</u>:

- For IISER Bhopal community entrepreneurs, please refer to Institute's Entrepreneurship policy.
- For entrepreneurs other than IISER Bhopal community or for external entrepreneurs, the equity sharing between the start-ups & IICE will be done in a similar fashion and would be as per the equity sharing approved by the IICE Governing Body. (Please refer Annexure VII for equity share and revenue share for internal/external start-ups).
- For physical pre-incubation, the equity sharing will be mutually decided and will be mentioned in the agreement/MOU on case-to-case basis.
- 7.3 For any specific additional support or extension of incubation, additional consideration may be charged on case-to-case basis through a separate agreement.

- 7.4 IICE will reserve the right to liquidate any or all the equity shares during exit or later, while the company will reserve the first right of refusal for purchase of such equity shares.
- 7.5 The IP that is generated, improved upon and/or licensed by the company, while incubating at IICE, can be sold to another existing and established company. In that case, IICE will have its share in the revenue generated as per the norms specified in the agreement. In case of internal start-ups, the Institute's IPR policy norms will be followed.
- 7.6 Additionally, the incubated company will pay the applicable usage charges in case they access the Common Instrumentation Facility at IICE or in the Central Instrumentation Facility of IISER-Bhopal.
- 7.7 IICE may dilute the consideration terms on a case-to-case basis when companies have achieved significant milestones as to revenues/investments at the time of making an application for incubation.

8. Incubation Charges:

- 8.1 The current monthly rentals and additional charges at IICE were approved in 2020-1/4th Meeting of the Governing Body and Management Committee of IICE.
- 8.2 The incubation charges for IISER Bhopal students, IISER Bhopal alumni, IISER Bhopal employees (faculty and research staff), and external Incubatees at IICE are as follows:

- 8.3 For Physical pre-incubation: The start-ups opting for physical pre-incubation will be offered one workbench in the shared incubation space. If they wish to acquire more than one workbench, they may request IICE for the same. Initial pre-incubation joining charges of ₹ 5,000/- (Five thousand only) which includes the office space (one workbench in the open incubation hall), which must be paid at the time of the incubation.
- 8.4 <u>For Virtual Incubatees</u>: Initial virtual incubation joining charges of ₹ 5,000/- (Five Thousand only) must be paid by the Incubatee at the time of the incubation. Thereafter, an annual amount of ₹ 5,000/- (Five Thousand only) will be charged in case the Incubatee continues the virtual incubation.

Note: The Incubation charges mentioned above may be amended and can be changed from time to time with the decision of Governing Body of IICE and if so, the changed and amended Incubation Charges shall be applicable to the Incubatee with immediate effect.

9. Tenure at IICE:

Tenure in IICE TBI would depend on terms of program. Companies under formal incubation will be permitted to stay in IICE, to begin with, for a period of 18 months. Further extension if any will be for another 18 months based on satisfactory performance review. Any stay beyond the total of 36 months, if requested by the incubate, is subject to approval of Governing Body of IICE and will entail additional consideration for incubation and mentorship support for maximum of 24 months. Thus, the maximum duration of stay of an Incubatee company at IICE can be 5 years. The rent for the extended period (4th year and 5th year) of incubation may be higher than initial rent for the first three years and will be decided at the time of extension.

For Physical pre-incubation: The physical pre-incubation period will be for 12 months which can be further extended for another 3 months on the recommendation of the Coordinator, IICE.

For virtual incubation: The virtual incubation period will be for 12 months which can be extended further on the recommendation of the Coordinator, IICE.

10. Exit (Graduation):

Incubated start-up will exit from the incubator under the following circumstances:

- 10.1 Completion of stay for eighteen months unless the stay is extended by IICE based on satisfactory performance review.
- 10.2 Acquisition of substantial investment or capital cash flow exceeds ₹ 5 crore or more, from an Angel Investor, Venture Capitalist, or any other private or public source.
- 10.3 The annual gross revenue of the start-up (excluding all the taxes) exceeds ₹ 5 crore, or the Net Annual Profit after Tax exceeds ₹ 1 crore.
- 10.4 Underperformance or non-viability of the business proposition: criteria for the same will be decided and applied by IICE on the case-to-case basis.
- 10.5 Irresolvable disputes between promoters/ founders. IICE will decide the position or point when disputes are deemed to be irresolvable.
- 10.6 Change in promoters'/ founders' team or business profile of company without concurrence of IICE.
- 10.7 When the company enters in an acquisition, merger or amalgamation deal or reorganization deal resulting in substantial change in the profile of the company, its promoters, directors, shareholders, products, or business plans, or when a company plans for a public issue.
- 10.8 Non-compliance of terms & conditions of IICE or the Institute.
- 10.9 Any other reasons which IICE may find it necessary for a start-up company to leave TBI.
- 10.10 Notwithstanding anything written elsewhere, the decision of IICE in connection with the exit of an incubated start-up shall be final and shall not be disputed by any incubated company at IICE.

- 10.11 If the start-up is convicted by any government entity or if any proceedings is pending against the start-ups in any court of law, then the IICE, IISER Bhopal reserves the right to impose the forceful discontinuation of the incubation.
- 10.12 If a start-up is found to indulge with any malicious practices against the law of land, the IICE reserves the right to terminate the agreement with a notice period of one (1) month. In such case, the equity of the start-up will be with the IICE only.
- 10.13 All the Incubatees will be governed by the rules, regulations, and laws of the IISER Bhopal.
 - *The terms and conditions and points mentioned in the Exit (Graduation) are all indicative and, the power to relax the same lies with the IICE Governing Body.

11. Conflicts of interest, Confidentiality of Information, and Code of Conduct:

- 11.1 Supported teams and start-up companies will have to adhere to the Conflicts of Interest policy of the Institute, Confidentiality, and Code of conduct.
- 11.2The situations with conflict of interest can arise and they are not totally unavoidable. In such cases, IICE expects the concerned people to disclose all information regarding the conflict of interest in a transparent manner to IICE and other relevant stakeholders. The proper Dispute Resolution Mechanism will be followed where the Director IISER Bhopal/President IICE will appoint a Grievance Redressal Committee (GRC) constituting of four (4) members, out of which one representative will be from the Incubatee. The recommendation(s) of the committee will be forwarded to the Director IISER Bhopal/ President IICE and the decision of the Director IISER Bhopal/ President IICE shall be final. If then also the dispute remains unsettled, alternate dispute redressal mechanism such as Mediation under respective judicial mechanism will be followed. The jurisdiction of the dispute resolution will be Madhya Pradesh (M.P.) state only.
- 11.3 IICE also expects its members and the start-up companies to practice confidentiality about sensitive information such as Intellectual Property and related data. IICE expects its Incubatees, staff and mentors to use appropriate judgement when talking to outsiders about internal plans, projects and intellectual property and not to reveal any potentially sensitive information.
- 11.4IICE expects the Incubatees and startup employees to follow code of conduct at the workplace and the rules of the institute.

12. Disclaimer:

The IICE supported entity will understand and acknowledge that IICE intends to provide supports and services to the company in good faith to pursue its objective to promote

entrepreneurship by converting innovative technologies/research to commercialization by incubating and supporting new enterprises. It is understood that by agreeing to provide various supports and services, IICE does not undertake responsibility for:

- Ensuring success of a supported company, its products/ process/ services or marketability.
- Ensuring quality of support and services provided by IICE to the complete satisfaction of the start-up companies or their promoters/ founders.
- Ensuring quality of services of the consultants engaged by the supported entities through IICE/IISER Bhopal network. Supported entities will have to apply their judgements before associating with them.
- IICE/IISER Bhopal or their employees to be held liable for any reason on account of progress or success of the start-up.

It is to be noted that the President IICE (Director, IISER Bhopal) shall have the authority to relax or modify any norms in exceptional cases based on the recommendation of the Management Advisory Committee (MAC) of the IICE.

- a) The company will use the premises at the IICE in the Institute for research and development purpose only which shall include the R&D experiments, publishing scientific data, innovation related activities, product development etc.
- b) The company may request the concerned authorities to make the use of the Institute laboratories, specialized equipment, central facilities, faculty, and student time etc. in established modes of (i) consultancy - retainer or problem specific and (ii) research programs, which will be jointly identified and implemented by the company's expertise and Institute faculty members and administered under the aegis of IICE, as per the prevailing policies of the Institute.

- c) The Company may provide internship and training opportunities for IISER Bhopal students and may sponsor several scholarships during the incubation period, as per the merit of the students.
- d) Based on the research progress at the company, the company may provide every year several projects where B.S and M.S students at the Institute will be involved.
- e) The Company will induct one representative from IISER Bhopal on its board as nominated by the Institute in consultation with the IICE, as and whenever applicable and required, and decided by the competent authorities of the Institute.
- f) The Company will prepare an annual report highlighting the progress of the company (along with audited accounts) and make it available to the IICE and IISER Bhopal by the end of every financial year for record / review / monitoring.
- g) Senior Technical Executives of the company will have to make regular presentations on the latest technological developments to the IICE and students/faculty of the IISER Bhopal or as and when suggested.

2. Infrastructure

IISER Bhopal by a License Agreement with the Company will provide limited space (as per the requirement and availability) to the Company to set up an office space and R&D labs at the IICE premises on terms and conditions stipulated in the said agreement.

3. Consideration

a)	The agreeable office space (Workbench number - 1 in open incubation area) located at the
	Incubation Centre on license basis solely for the purpose of the project. The charges for the
	allocated space will be calculated as given below.

The above-mentioned charges do not include any charges for the equipment and facilities available on a shared basis for the Company's at the Instrumentation facility at IICE. The equipment and facilities can be made available for use by the Company by paying additional charges for the facilities as per the IICE policies. The list of the equipment and facilities available and their charges are mentioned in Annexure – I which forms part of this agreement.

If there is a separate instrument installed / brought to the IICE premises by the start-up, the energy consumption by the equipment used for prototyping/production/manufacturing will be charged as per actuals. Accordingly, the same shall be billed monthly to the Company as per the electricity rate per unit.

- d) The Company shall pay the monthly charges for every month, promptly, and regularly. They shall pay the monthly Charges on or before the 7th day of every English Calendar month in advance. Failing to comply with the condition may attract a penalty @ 1% of the total monthly charge for each day of delay and this may be exercised at the discretion of the IICE.
- e) The Company will pay up to 2 % of the gross annual turnover of the Company to the IICE till the company is incubated at the IICE. To calculate the 2% of the gross annual turnover, the lower cap will be ₹ 50,00,000/- (Rupees Fifty lakhs) of annual turnover and the upper will be ₹ 7,00,00,000/- (Rupees Seven Crores) of annual turnover. The payment shall be deemed as due for payment to the Institute at the end of each financial year irrespective of whether any formal invoice is raised or not raised by IISER Bhopal or IICE for the purpose. The revenue would be transferred to the IICE bank account only by cheque / DD / Net Banking.
- f) The Company shall, within two months of the commencement of incubation, shall issue 10% fully paid-up equity shares in the company to the IICE after making payment on Face Value of the shares (maximum ₹ 10/- per share).
- g) Upon transfer of the above-said equity shares to the IICE, the Company will have an "Exclusive Right" on the Institute's technology/patent developed by the Company without any additional fee by entering into a separate "Exclusive License" agreement with the Institute.

h) IISER Bhopal shall have sole and absolute right to decide (i) whether to offer option of buyback of these equity shares by the Company, (ii) quantum thereof, (iii) their valuation and (iv) terms of payment of buyback of equity shares, if any. The valuation of shares for buyback by the Company shall be on a price mutually agreed by both the parties or on the price calculated by an Independent valuer appointed with mutual consent.

The expenses of appointing the independent valuer and the fee charged by the valuers will be borne by the Company.

- i) The Company shall have the option to buy-back the shares at the price to be calculated as per above within 30 days from the date of offer for buy-back. If the Company fails to buy-back the shares as mentioned above, then the IISER Bhopal shall be free to treat with the shares in whatever way that suits without further reference to the company.
- j) The Company will be able to make executive, management, financial, and operational decisions of all kinds solely on its own, however, the company may seek support or consultation from IICE and IISER Bhopal as and when required during the agreement period.

4. Others

The Company also agrees as under:

- a) To submit a business plan stating the novelty of the technology/idea, business prospects including demand and supply, need for IISER Bhopal expertise, laboratory and infrastructural utilization for the research and development, commercialization of the technology developed, IPR ownership, financial plan etc.
- b) To restrict activities and operations as per the business plan finally accepted by IISER Bhopal and to comply with the guidelines, if any; issued by IISER Bhopal for operations of the Company from time to time.
- c) To furnish information, periodic reports as and when desired by IICE / IISER Bhopal Board of Governors / other committees in the institute. The requisitioned information / reports can be as part of any exercise to monitor / review the progress of incubation in line with the original/revised Business Plan submitted to the institute or to meet requirement of special / contingent / unforeseen circumstance. This also includes any audio-visual presentation requisitioned by IISER Bhopal.
- d) To inform the IICE / IISER Bhopal about all potential biochemical hazard, inflammable materials, and other possible hazards due to the use of material/equipment in the office space. Also, the Company should observe that noise levels are kept at minimum and, no abnormal noise by any machine or by their employees or visitors should be made. Any complaint of high noise level will result in appropriate action by the IICE.

- e) Not to make any structural changes in the rented premises except the installation of machines / equipment without the prior consent of the IICE / IISER Bhopal.

- h) The Company hereby indemnifies the IICE / IISER Bhopal, and shall always keep indemnified and hold the IICE / IISER Bhopal, its employees, personnel, officers, directors, (hereinafter collectively referred to as "Personnel") harmless from and against any and all losses, liabilities, claims, actions, costs and expenses (including attorneys' fees) relating to, resulting directly from or in any way arising out of any claim, suit or proceeding brought against the IICE / IISER Bhopal as a result of:
 - ➤ an act or omission of negligence or willful misconduct of the Company, employees in the performance of the obligations of the Company under this agreement; and/or
 - > claims made by employees who are deployed by the Company; and/or
 - ➤ breach of any of the terms of this agreement or breach of any representation or false representation or inaccurate statement or assurance or covenant or warranty of the Company under this agreement; and/or
 - ➤ Gross negligence or willful and gross misconduct attributable to the Industrial Collaborator or its employees.
- i) The agreement can be terminated by either of the parties by giving a notice of thirty (30) days. On termination of this Agreement/License, the Company shall return the premises to the IICE in the same condition as was handed over along with fittings and facilities provided in the premises.
- j) No variation or addition to this agreement entered in this regard shall be binding on the parties hereto, unless the same shall be recorded in writing and duly signed by both the parties to this agreement. An additional agreement may be prepared if required, if any other clauses or terms and conditions are added or altered later.
- k) Any/all disputes between the Company and the Institute & IICE shall be resolved through the Dispute Resolution Mechanism where the Director IISER Bhopal/President IICE will appoint a Grievance Redressal Committee (GRC) constituting of four (4) members, out of which one representative will be from the Incubatee. The recommendation(s) of the committee will be forwarded to the Director

IISER Bhopal/President IICE and the decision of the Director IISER Bhopal/President IICE shall be final. If then also the dispute remains unsettled then, alternate dispute redressal mechanism such as Mediation under respective judicial mechanism will be followed. The jurisdiction of the dispute resolution will be Madhya Pradesh (M.P.) state only.

- 1) The IICE / IISER Bhopal holds all the rights to amend any clause or covenants in the above-mentioned agreement. The same shall be binding for all.
- m) The IICE / IISER Bhopal holds all the rights to inspect the premises at any time with or without prior communication to the Company. Accordingly, the Company shall allow free and unhindered inspection to the IICE / IISER Bhopal representatives.
